Dues:

Meetings:

Spring business meeting and recognition of new members – April/May in connection with the Kentucky Extension Homemakers Association Annual Meeting. : A “no bake” sale will be held at this meeting, and those donations will go toward the Kentucky Master Farm Homemaker Scholarship.

Summer business meeting and informal gathering- often in July/August but scheduled according to dates recommended by the individual(s) hosting the activity. One or more Master Farm members usually host the summer meeting at or near their home. At this meeting there will be a “dough bowl” voluntary collection which will go toward the Kentucky Master Farm Homemaker Scholarship.
