STATE MEETING REGISTRATION REFUND POLICY

- Registrations are first-come, first-served once payment is received. The State Treasurer will continue to issue refunds for fee-based workshop registrations once they are full. Those who wish to attend workshops that include a fee are encouraged to submit their registrations quickly.
- Those who wish to cancel their entire registration will not receive a full refund. If it is canceled before the final registration deadline, half will be refunded. After the final registration deadline, no refunds will be issued.
- Registration may be transferred to another individual rather than canceling.

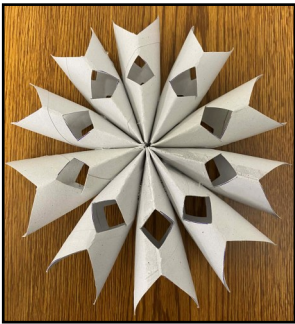

UK Corner

The University of Kentucky Family and Consumer Science (FCS) Extension program remains committed to strengthening families across the Commonwealth. February Agent Training is right around the corner, and we are excited about the new programs that soon will be available for agents to offer at the county level. We also have made significant progress in the search for our next Assistant Director of FCS Extension. Three outstanding candidates are joining us on UK's campus for presentations and interviews in February.

FCS Extension continues to focus on securing extramural funding, and we are pleased to maintain our work with the Nutrition Education Program as well as Children, Youth, and Families at Risk, through grant support. In addition, I am excited to share that through our collaboration with UK HealthCare and the Advancing Kentucky Together Network, a statewide partnership committed to building a healthier Kentucky, FCS Extension is hiring an Extension Associate for Nutrition and an Extension Specialist for Substance Use Recovery and Prevention. These new positions will allow us to expand our reach and deepen our impact, particularly in nutrition and substance use recovery and prevention efforts. We also are actively filling positions at the county level.
